L.A. Coliseum's \$270-million renovation is about to start construction following the strong sales of premium seating. Twenty Founders Suites, 20 traditional suites and 24 loge boxes are mostly sold out. The refurbished stadium will debut in 2019.

The old scoreboard at South Point Hotel & Casino, Las Vegas, has been replaced with a new 4-millimeter line spacing video display that nearly triples its size. The 13,797-pound display will be suspended from the ceiling of the 4,600-seat



arena. The two larger "sideline" screens measure 12.5 feet high by 21.5 feet wide, while the two smaller "end zone" screens measure 14 feet high by 9.5 feet wide. In addition, the panels comprise 588 individual modules with a total of 2,718,912 pixels at three LEDs per pixel, totaling more than 8.1 million LEDs.

Hosts Global Launches Volunteer Time Off Program


